## The roof and eyes of Israel

At 2,236 meters, Mount Hermon is Israel's tallest peak, offering snow in winter and cool breezes in summer. It's a hub for skiing, hiking, and birdwatching. In the Six-Day War (1967), Israel gained control of Mount Hermon, a key strategic location. The mountain is called the "Eyes of the Nation" for its strategic value and meteorological station. Take a cable car to the summit for panoramic views of Israel, Lebanon, and Syria.
