Rosh Hanikra's chalk cliffs and sea grottos are a natural wonder. In quieter times, visitors would descend by cable car to explore the grottos and learn about the site's role in connecting British Palestine to Lebanon. The Rosh Hanikra railway tunnel, built during World War II, symbolized regional connectivity before being destroyed to prevent military use. The grottos were created by wave erosion over thousands of years, forming intricate sea caves.
